

Flowerbed III - Overview

This flowerbed would do best in a sunny or slightly shaded location, in a moderately fertile soil providing sufficient amount of moisture. The plants, chosen for this flowerbed, will be predominantly violet or pinkish in color.

While the perennials are still reawakening in spring (silver grass plants reawaken even later), in this flowerbed season will start with bulb flowers tulips and large-blooming ornamental onions that will add some color while the other plants are still reawakening.

At the start of summer, lady's mantle blossoms will fill the air with their honey-sweet scent. As they bloom they form a gigantic cloud of blossoms. And if you trim them once they've finished blossoming they'll blossom again. Pink, large-blooming snakeweed flowers will rise gently above the lady's mantle.

Fall is this flowerbeds most colorful time. The beautiful silver grass will reveal itself in full grace in fall. Blue-green clumps of fescue will look wonderful at its base with its overhanging leaves. The dark red stonecrop 'Matrona' will add a nice accent to the flowerbed with its decorative foliage. Dark pink coneflowers will rise above the stonecrops and are lovely even after they've finished blossoming, as they stand out in autumn with their dark brown seedpods. Purple joe pye weed will rise up at the back of the flowerbed reaching 2m height if proper care is provided they are a very impressive in their beauty! In turn, the bright anemones with their endless blossoms will delight even until the first frosts.
